### Looking Forward to Her Future

### Your support for HousingPlus helped Heaven through a time of grief

HousingPlus tenant Heaven will never forget how having a home impacted her mother. "Before we got to the shelter, the place we were living in was in terrible condition," says Heaven. "When we were in the shelter my mom was very depressed. We lost pictures, shoes, clothes, everything. When we came here, we finally got to fulfill our needs."

Once the family moved into their HousingPlus apartment in early 2022, Heaven's mom would start the weekend with a joyful ritual: "My mom, Tina Guinty, was amazing. Early in the morning, she would put on loud music—she wanted to clean the house. She really wanted to keep it clean because where we lived before, it was awful."

While living in this apartment, Heaven was able to begin working on her long-term goals. During her Summer Youth Employment job, she had the opportunity to learn alongside a local Brooklyn business owner. "I knew I wanted to work for myself," says Heaven.

In September 2022, as Heaven was starting her senior year of high school, her mom passed away due to complications of Type 2 Diabetes. "When I was at my lowest, the staff at HousingPlus were really helpful," she says.

Heaven's case manager connected her with financial aid and a local food pantry, and was also a phone call away for support. "They helped me so much in the first few months after my mom's passing," she says.

Two years later, Heaven's perseverance—and the stability of having a place to call home—has helped her continue forward. "Because I was in a shelter, I did not think I had what it takes to be in college," she says. But Heaven worked to access scholarships.



Today, she is attending Mercy University, majoring in Business Administration and Entrepreneurship.

Heaven has also built a business idea—first formulated during her senior year—into a source of passive income. Her idea was inspired, of course, by her mom, and her mom's experience as a diabetic. Heaven thought of a way to provide healthier snacks to high school students by stocking an onsite vending machine with more nutritious options. Heaven says she knows that teenagers love to eat junk, which is why she made sure that in *her* vending machine, the prices for unhealthy options were higher than healthy options. "I want the pricing to be opposite from what it's like in grocery stores," says Heaven.

The vending machine idea isn't her only idea: Heaven also has a passion for cooking and hopes to one day be able to open a food truck that serves fresh, nutritious foods.

We do not doubt that Heaven will continue to thrive, thanks, in part, to the stability we can provide because of our friends' and donors' support of HousingPlus.

### From a Devastating Break-in to Building a Business

Housing, and donors like you, helped a mother and Veteran find a place to grow

Tea and her son spent years without permanent, stable housing. As a Veteran, Tea sustained a traumatic brain injury and lived with PTSD. When her son was just a year old, Tea lost her apartment in New Jersey. Not long later, she was robbed while attempting to move into a new place.

Today, thanks to your generosity, Tea has been in her HousingPlus apartment for eight years. It has given her a place to raise her son through his teenage years and into young adulthood. Now, at age 23, Tea's son has completed a training course to become a security guard and started a new job in late September.

Having a home helped Tea begin to think of her destiny differently. She and her wife, Mars, realized they were losing time with their kids due to their hectic schedules in the restaurant industry. Mars has a son who is four years younger than Tea's.

At HousingPlus, Tea received assistance that led to her and Mars opening their own business called "Tea on Mars." The two business owners have focused on selling handmade items by Indigenous and African creators, including products such as waistbeads, sage smudges, and crystals.

Tea on Mars started as a street vending business, but they plan to move to a primarily online shop. In the coming months, Tea and Mars also hope to be able to travel to meet some of the creators of the goods they are selling.

Tea recognizes that the help she found at HousingPlus influenced her life. "Everything you need help with, they have solutions to move forward. Not just for me as a Veteran, but as a woman...It's a safe space, everyone is here to genuinely help you."

From this new space, staff will work directly with tenants from an office in the building, providing a place for every resident to come to get advice and assistance as they need it. As justice-involved individuals, housing can be extremely difficult to find. We are so thankful that we can provide transitional apartments to give people leaving incarceration an opportunity to find community and increase their chances of obtaining and maintaining employment.

Since entering the Justice Works program, some tenants have regained visitation rights with their children, gotten employment, found permanent housing, and stayed sober. It is a testament to their strength, the incredible work of our team members, and finally, to you, our donors, who continue to support these life-changing programs. Every individual deserves a place to call home, and at our new location, dozens more individuals and families will be able to do so.
