As our staff visited tenants and welcomed them to their homes at our new location in the Bronx, the tenants shared what they planned to prepare for dinner, taking full use of their kitchen spaces.

We are so excited to see how the new space will transform the lives of tenants both past and present, including Mary, whose story we hope to share with you in more detail in the coming months.

From this new space, staff will work directly with tenants from an office in the building, providing a place for every resident to come to get advice and assistance as they need it. As justice-involved individuals, housing can be extremely difficult to find. We are so thankful that we can provide transitional apartments to give people leaving incarceration an opportunity to find community and increase their chances of obtaining and maintaining employment.

Since entering the Justice Works program, some tenants have regained visitation rights with their children, gotten employment, found permanent housing, and stayed sober. It is a testament to their strength, the incredible work of our team members, and finally, to you, our donors, who continue to support these life-changing programs. Every individual deserves a place to call home, and at our new location, dozens more individuals and families will be able to do so.
